- The game will take place at Nassau Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Uniondale, N.Y., immediately following the regularly scheduled NHL contest between the <u>New York Islanders</u> and Pittsburgh Penguins. Proceeds from the game will benefit the Long Island Chapter of <u>Autism Speaks</u>.
- The Hockey Helping Kids program has raised approximately \$30,000 so far this season for a range of charities and organizations, including the Autism Society of Minnesota, Temple University's Men's Hockey and Women's Gymnastics programs, Philadelphia PowerPlay and the Autism Society of Colorado.
- Earlier this season, the CommVault team played a three-game series against the Western Women's Hockey League (WWHL) champion <u>Minnesota Whitecaps</u>. Additional charity games were played against the U.S. Air Force and the Canadian Women's hockey team and staff.
